Lancaster Watch Weekend to Debut in September, Celebrating America's Horological Heritage

Lancaster, PA – Watch enthusiasts and collectors from across the country will gather in Lancaster, PA, for the inaugural Lancaster Watch Weekend on September 26–28, 2025.

Lancaster is the perfect setting for this event. The county's rich history of watchmaking perpetuates in so many ways. Visitors will immerse themselves, getting hands-on with watchmaking, seeing historic horological treasures up close, and enjoying the well-preserved historic building that helped perpetuate the Lancaster legacy.

Lancaster Watch Weekend is open to all, though museum entry fees apply and some of the events require a reservation. Hosted by the <u>National Watch & Clock Museum</u>, <u>Hamilton Watch Boutique</u>, <u>RGM Watch Co.</u>, and <u>Brent Miller Jewelers</u>, the three-day program will feature exhibits, horological experiences, guided tours, and presentations that celebrate the past, present, and future of watchmaking.

Events will take place at the National Watch & Clock Museum in Columbia, the Hamilton Watch Boutique in the historic Bowman building on N. Duke St. in Lancaster, Brent Miller Jewelers on Manheim Pike in Lancaster, RGM Watch Co. in Mount Joy, and Clock Towers Condominiums on Columbia Ave., Lancaster for a Hamilton old factory tour.

National groups <u>RedBar</u> and the <u>Horological Society of New York</u> will also participate in the event, bringing their communities of passionate collectors and watch lovers into the mix.

The National Watch & Clock Museum is run by the National Association of Watch & Clock Collectors (NAWCC), a nonprofit member organization dedicated to preserving and promoting the art and science of timekeeping. Recently updated and expanded displays include the Hamilton and Bulova exhibits, the history of wristwatches exhibit, and the Public Time gallery.
